- **Transportation**

The San Francisco Municipal Railway (MUNI) provides transportation to all points of interest within San Francisco. The Muni system operates both diesel and electric trolley buses, historic and Metro streetcars, and the world-famous cable cars. The historic streetcars run on the "F" Market and Wharves line, and the Metro streetcars

(light rail vehicles) run in the Market Street subway and on the surface in outlying areas.

Adult bus, streetcar and Muni Metro fare is \$1.50

Youth (5-17 yrs.), Senior (65+yrs.) & Disabled 35 cents.

Cable car tickets cost \$5.

Senior & disabled persons discounted cable car tickets (available from 9pm-1am and 5am-7am)

Except on the cable cars, exact change is necessary for cash fares. Transfers are issued free upon request at the time the fare is paid for bus or streetcar service.

Keep the transfer as required proof of payment verification when checked by transit officials. Transfers are valid for 90 minutes for two boardings in any direction. Cable car fares are one-way fares-transfers are neither issued nor accepted for cable car service.

Transit Routes from the Visitor Information Center on Powell & Market Street:

3Com Park: Bus#9X Stadium Express from Stockton & Market Streets. Services begin 2.5 to 3 hours before game time. Call 673-6864 for schedules.

Alamo Square: Bus #21 westbound to the corner of Hayes & Pierce Streets. Bus #21 also continues on to Golden Gate Park (8th Ave & Fulton Street)

Cable Car Barn: Board any cable car on Powell Street to Washington & Mason Streets.

California Palace of the Legion of Honor/Lincoln Park: Bus #38 or #38L on Geary Street to 33rd Ave; walk north on 34th Ave. to park entrance (short walk), or transfer to northbound bus #18 on 33rd Ave. to the end of the line.

Castro: Muni Metro underground "K", "L", or "M" outbound to the Castro Street Station or the historic "F" line on Market to Castro and Market Streets.

Chinatown: Walk two blocks east on Market Street to Grant Ave. Walk north on Grant Ave. to Chinatown Gateway at Bush Street. Point of Interest: Chinese Historical Society of America, 965 Clay St.; Chinese Cultural Center, 750 Kearny Street.

Civic Center: (City Hall, Opera House, Davies Symphony Hall, Main Library and Bill Graham Civic Auditorium) Bus #5 or #21 westbound on Market Street or Muni Metro underground to Civic Center Station. Point of Interest: San Francisco Performing Arts & Library Museum, 401 Van Ness Ave. Fourth Floor.

Cliff House/Seal Rocks: Bus#38 (destination-48th Avenue and Point Lobos); or 38L on Geary Street to the end of the line at 48th and Point Lobos Avenues and walk down Point Lobos Avenue.

Coit Tower/Telegraph Hill (North Beach): Bus#15, #30, or #45 from Market and Kearny to Union Street (Washington Square); transfer to bus #39 to Coit Tower. Bus #39 continues on to Fisherman's Wharf and Pier 39.

Exploratorium/Palace of Fine Arts/Marina Green: Bus #30 from Kearny and Market streets to the end of the line.

Ferry Building/Embarcadero Center: Historic "F" line on Market to the Ferry Building; or Muni Metro inbound to Embarcadero station.

Fisherman's Wharf: (Pier 39/The Cannery/Ghiradelli Square/Pier 41/Aquatic Park/The Anchorage/National Maritime Museum/Municipal Pier) Powell-Hyde or Powell-Mason cable car from Powell and Market Streets; by the historic "F" line heading outbound on Market or by bus from Kearny and Market, #15 to the end of the line, or #30 to North Point Street.

Fort Mason: Bus #30 from Kearny and Market to Chestnut and Laguna Streets; walk north on Laguna Street or transfer to bus #28. To reach the Youth Hostel, get off at Van Ness Avenue and North Point Street; walk west on Bay Street, then turn right into Fort Mason. Point of Interest: Museum of Craft and Folk Art, Bldg. A.

Golden Gate Bridge/Fort Point: Muni: bus#30 from Kearny and Market to Chestnut and Laguna Streets; transfer to a southbound bus #28 (toward Daly City BART). Golden Gate Transit: any GG Transit bus from Mission and Fifth Streets to the Toll Plaza (\$2.25). Bus #20 (weekday) and #10 (weekend) also stop near the Vista Point on the other side of the bridge and continue on to Sausalito (\$2.50).

Golden Gate Park: For the Japanese Tea Garden, Strybing Aboretum, Music Concourse, or Academy of Sciences, take a westbound bus #5 or #21 on Market Street to Fulton Street and Eighth Avenue and walk into the park; or take the Muni Metro "N" underground outbound to Irving Street and Ninth Avenue and walk north on Ninth Avenue.

Haight Ashbury: Bus #6, #7, or #71 from the bus islands in the middle of Market Street to Haight Street and Masonic Avenue.

Japan Center/Japantown: Bus #2, 3, or 4 on Stter to Buchanan Street.

Lombard Street/Russian Hill: Powell-Hyde cable car from Powell Street to Lombard Street; or bus #45 from Kearny and Market to Union and Hyde and walk north on Hyde to Lombard.

Mission District/Mission Dolores: Muni: bus #14 westbound on Mission Street to 16th Steet or beyond. BART: Daly City or Colma train to 24th Street. To reach Mission Dolores: Muni Metro "J" to Church and 16th, walk one block east on 16th Street.

Moscone Center: Walk one block east on Market to Fourth Street. Walk south on Fourth Street two blocks to Howard Street. Point of Interest: Zeum, 221 Fourth Street, The Society of California Pioneers, 300 Fourth Street.

Museum of Modern Art/Center for the Arts/Yerba Buena Gardens: Walk two blocks east on Market to Third Street. Walk south on Third Street 1.5 blocks. Points of Interest: California Historical Society, 678 Mission Street; Cartoon Art Museum, 655 Mission Street.

Nob Hill/Grace Cathedral/Nob Hill Masonic Auditorium: Any cable car on Powell Street to California Street.

Ocean Beach: Bus #5 or #31 on Market Street to the end of the line.

Pacific Bell Park: Take Ballpark Shuttle from Second and Market Streets, or the special Muni service at the Montgomery BART station. Buses #15, #30, #47, #45 and the Muni "N" line provide service to the ballpark.

Twin Peaks: Muni Metro underground "K", "L", or "M" to Forest Hill Station. Across the street from the station, take bus #36. Get off at Marview and Skyview; walk up Marview to Farview. Turn right on unmarked footpath and walk to the overlook. Or take the Muni Metro underground "K", "L" or "M" outbound to Castro Street, transfer to bus #37 Corbett across from the Muni depot.

Union Street: Bus #45 from Kearny and Market Streets to Octavia Street and beyond.

Zoo: Muni Metro "L" outbound to the end of the line.
